Some of our younger players played well and one of them was adjudged as man-of-the-man by one of the directors, and who

could argue with that. Midfielder Jake Meakin had a great game getting stuck in and making some impressive passes.

Overall, there were plenty of positives that come out of that game. We have not had as many pre-season friendly games as we'd have liked to get the side gelling, that along with senior players being absent for various reasons provided Carl and Paul with a headache. It will take a few games for the team to settle but there are a few good signs.

Today is our first game in this season's FA Cup competition. Yes, we are just into August and already playing in England football's most prestigious games. It hardly seems five minutes since the final was played and we are still to play the Community Shield.

The last decent FA Cup run came back on 14th November 1998 when we ran Walsall close to bringing them back to the Moat Ground for a replay losing 1-0. If you were at the game like me the end of the ground, we were allotted were, it's been estimated, stood 1,000 supporters. Great support, great atmosphere.

Let's hope days like that are just around the corner. Enjoy the game.

Jack Andrews - Left sided central defender Andrews was a young professional at Nottingham Forest and counts Boston United, Eastwood, Quorn and Basford United among his former clubs.

Louis Anthony - Central defender Louis Anthony arrives at the club from Stone Old Alleynians. Louis has impressed in both of the club's friendly fixtures so far in pre-season and has looked a big, strong, physical presence. Louis has good experience at the level and is a very solid addition to the developing squad.

Nathan Banton - Defender now in his second season with the club signed from Kimberley MW.

Fin Barker - Barker has signed for the club following a brief spell at Rovers early last season on loan from Solihull Moors. Despite a quite sensational debut performance at The Moat against Boldmere St Michaels, his loan spell was brought to a premature end by a nasty concussion suffered in the following game. Finn now links up with the club full time having moved away permanently from Solihull.

Alex Britton - Locally based player joins the club from divisional rivals Heanor Town, where he has been a mainstay in their side for the past few seasons. Britton, a former youth player at Burton Albion, had a brief loan spell with Gresley Rovers many years ago. His addition will bring valuable defensive stability and know-how to the club's young, attack-minded squad.

Haydn Brown – Locally based player who can make explosive runs into the area causing problems for any defence also in his second season.

Ben Gough - Defender signed for the club in close seasn and will add experience to the squad.

Bekir Halil – Combative midfielder signed again for Rovers during the close season. Former clubs include Worcester City, Hinckley AFC and Sporting Khalsa

Ste Hart – Another player that needs no introduction. He was pivotal the last time Rovers were in the UCL with his goals helping the club to be promoted.

Dylan Hunniford - Young youth team graduate Dylan is an exciting prospect who has made a notable impression. We are expecting further development from Dylan and believe he has a bright future at the club. Was voted supporters' player of the year 2023-2024.

Ryan King - Kingy might just be the most naturally gifted at the club but unfortunately for him, injuries and misfortune have not been kind to him. He still has a little while to get back to full fitness, but the prognosis looks good.

Kane Lee – A local lad who needs no introduction. Lee returns to the club after brief spells at Loughborough Dynamo and AFC Wulfrunians.

Jake Meakin - Young midfielder signed in close season.

Danny Munday - Danny has a rich history with the club and

is beloved by supporters for his dynamic performances and significant contribution to our promotion in the 2021/22 season. He aims to add to his impressive record of 34 goals in 71 appearances.

Osaze Okuonghae - defender has an imposing stature and real ability and is an exciting prospect for the football club very much in the mold of George Clark. He has featured prominently in both friendly fixtures to date and has really impressed. We are so excited about Osaze. Another lengthy spell linking up with Paul Tomlinson yielded strong league campaigns, cup wins, and significant FA Cup and FA Vase runs, before a step up in levels with Market Drayton Town, Quorn, Evesham United and AFC Wulfrunians

Paul Tomlinson (Assistant Manager) Former professional player with Sheffield United who was once subject of a transfer approach from 'big' Jack Charlton when manager at Newcastle United. Played for Stafford Rangers and Halesowen Harriers before moving into management and coaching. Previously Assistant Manager at Alvechurch, Halesowen Town and Evesham United, before linking with a former player of his in Carl Abbott, and subsequently becoming his long-term number two through lengthy and hugely successful spells at Hinckley, Quorn, Market Drayton Town and a second spell with Evesham United

LICHFIELD CITY HISTORY

The Club began life in the 1970's as Beacon Rangers before changing it's name to Beacon Park. In June 2006 a decision was made by the Committee to change the club's name to Lichfield City FC in order to raise its profile in the local community.

We achieved our Charter Standard award within a year and in 2009 achieved the status of Charter Standard Community Club which is the pinnacle award for Charter Standard Clubs.

In 2010 Lichfield City FC was recognised by Staffordshire FA as the best Community Club in Staffordshire

In 2007 we took on the lease for the site at Brownsfield Road giving the club a recognised home.

In 2008 we moved our open age team from the Burton & District League into the Midland Football Combination, so that we could provide our junior members with an exit route into a better standard of football. That season we finished 5th, but we were fortunate enough to gain promotion to the second division after a league restructure.

In 2009 / 2010 we finished 3rd but missed out on back to back promotions as only the top 2 teams got promoted.

For the 2010 / 2011 season we moved our reserve team into the Midland Football Combination to benefit from the improved professionalism, standard and playing facilities that the league provide. That season our first team finished 4th in the 2nd division and again gained promotion due to a league restructure. Season 2011/2012 was a great season with the reserves finishing runners up in the reserve division 2 and our first team a creditable 4th in the first division. After successfully gaining planning permission for floodlights, we had the platform in place for premier division football and following the Mid Comb AGM, both our teams were promoted to their respective premier leagues for season 2012/2013. We installed floodlights, perimeter fence, two covered stands and spectator path to the pitch to meet the higher league ground grading requirements.

In 2018 we installed a 3G pitch to accommodate the 350 participants playing football within the football club and hoping to attract more players to our ever growing Junior Section which has risen to 500.

In 2021 our 1st team gained promotion to The Midland

Football League Premier Division, and in the first season finished in third place.

More ground developments have since taken place with a refurbishment to our lounge, a new home dressing room, refurbished away & officials dressing rooms, an additional covered seating stand, a covered standing terrace behind the far goal, turnstile block, TV gantry, spectator toilets, protected player walkway - all of which all give our Trade Tyre Community Stadium a feeling of a non league football stadium.

Even more developments are taking place as we are constructing a cafe within our premises which includes alterations to our kitchen and redesigning of our large function suite. Very exciting times both on and off the pitch.

We finished 11th in 2022-23 a season that didn't quite live up to the previous league campaign but finish the season on Tuesday 30th May with a massive high - we won the JW Hunt Cup, at The Molineux Stadium, beating Tividale 1-0 thanks to a 1st half goal from our record appearance holder Joe Haines, Captain Kyle Patterson picked up the Man of The Match award on a great night for our football club.

Season 2023-24 is our best season to date. We finished 2nd in the MFL Premier Division and missed out on promotion after a 3-1 defeat to Darlaston Town in the Playoff Final. During this season we added a score board and media cabin to the bottom corner of our ground and updated our stadium speaker system.

During a campaign where we played 57 games we reached three semi-finals, losing 2-1 away to Congleton Town in the League Cup and we went out of the Walsall Senior Cup on penalties after drawing 3-3 with Step 2 Rushall Olympic.

We reached the JW Hunt Cup Final for the second season running after a very youthful side beat Wolverhampton Casuals on penalties. After the game ended 1-1 Paul Hathaway was the Lichfield City hero saving four penalties and scoring the best penalty of the evening to set up a return to The Molineux. We retained the JW Hunt Cup after Joe Haines got another final goal and Man of The Match Leighton McMenemy scored a brace as we beat Wolverhampton Sporting 3-1 to secure back to back triumphs at The Molineux.

ROVERS RECALLED - A Century, and more, of the FA Cup

From 1895 to the demise of the club in 2009 the Qualifying Rounds of the world's most famous football competition was eagerly anticipated by players, officials and fans alike.

In the first season of entry 1895-96, Clay Cross were defeated on away soil before visitors Heanor triumphed 4-0 in South Derbyshire. The same opponents again put Rovers out during the following term after Buxton and Stapleford had been beaten on the road.

During the next eight seasons Rovers and today's visitors Coalville Town, got to know each other well, the clubs being drawn against each other six times! Although Town advanced to the next round following the first two games, Rovers were successful in the four subsequent meetings.

Gresley fought through to Round 1 of the competition on three occasions - 1930, 1994 & 1998 - being defeated by Football League opposition each time, but twice threatening an upset in closely contested games.

In the autumn of 1930 the team battled past Rothwell, Desborough, Market Harborough and Loughborough Corinthians before meeting Kings Lynn at the Moat Ground on 15 November in the Fourth Qualifying Round. A crowd of around 3,000 watched the following team defeat the East Anglian visitors 4-1 - Waring, Wheeldon, Whittaker, Chambers, Brewin, Mee, Bird, T Warren, Dunleavey, Claye and Topliss - with Dunleavey (3) and Bird scoring.

The club's First Round reward was a trip to York City lying mid table in Division Thee North. Rovers team showed only one change from the previous round - W Warren for Brewin - and travelled north on the morning of the game, accompanied by a good number of supporters.

Despite recent rain, the pitch was in good condition as the home side exerted pressure from the start in front of a 4,000 crowd. Rovers' defence held firm, goalkeeper Waring making several good saves, but could not prevent City taking the lead midway through the first half.

The visitors shocked the Football League side seven minutes after the interval however with Tommy Warren equalising. Now under severe pressure, Rovers defence held out until the final minutes of the tie when York scored twice to record a 3-1 victory, much to the relief of the home fans

Rovers had a couple of exciting cup runs in the mid 1950's, beating Ilkeston, Matlock, South Normanton in 1953-54 to earn a Fourth Qualifying Round tie at Nuneaton. Borough were then one of the strongest local

non-league sides and Rovers were trounced 4-1 in front of a 6,500 Manor Park crowd which included around 2,000 from the South Derbyshire and Burton area.

During the following campaign - Rovers first in the Birmingham League - Basford and Matlock were defeated before old adversaries llkeston visited the Moat, bringing some 600 fans which created a tense atmosphere in the crowded ground. After going behind, home goals from Haines and Allen looked to have made the game safe but the visitors equalised from the penalty spot with minutes remaining.

The replay exhausted players and fans alike! Five minutes after the interval Rovers were 4-1 ahead, Haines and Sketchley each scoring twice - visiting players Newball and McGuire sustained injuries, then Ilkeston levelled the scores to face extra time. The injured Newball saved a penalty but Town eventually grabbed the winner to triumph 5-4. Rovers (both games): Newball, McGuire, Cook, Cashmore, Tunstall, E Duggins, Boulton, G Duggins, Sketchley, Haines, Allen.

Gresley suffered a lean cup spell during the 1970's winning just a single tie, 1974-75 1-0 First Qualifying Round victory over Hednesford Town. The 1980's were more fruitful, the 1985-86 term seeing a run to the Fourth Qualifying Round, 17 goals being scored in the victories over Friar Lane, Oldswinford, Worksop and Alfreton. The bubble burst in London, a 2-0 defeat being inflicted on a brave Rovers side by Isthmian League Leyton Wingate.

On to the 1990's and two First Round appreances! In the 1994-95 competition ties against Sandwell Borough, Stourport Swifts, Leek and the long trip to Braintree, were successfully navigated only for a second half collapse at Crewe's Gresty Road ground to shatter Rovers' hopes. The line-up for the 7-1 defeat was Aston, Dick, Harbey, Denby, Evans, Stanborough, Elliott (Wardle), Rigg, Holmes, Garner, Marsden (Devaney). Attendance 4.539, goal scorer Devaney.

In 1998-99 three 2-1 victories over Shepshed, Halesowen and Frickley were rewarded with a visit to Walsall's Bescot Stadium which, although ending in defeat, was a close run contest. 

My name is Thomas Andrew Curtis; however, I am better known to my family and friends as 'Chopper'. I lived in Swadlincote with my Mum and Brother.

On Friday 8th December 2023, I was driving home from visiting a friend who's in a wheelchair after a motor cross accident. I was driving through wet muddy lanes, when unfortunately, I drove up a mud verge and hitting a sign face on.

I turned away from the sign and rolled the van into 3 fields. I was flung out of the driver's side window and fell to the ground.

I was taken straight to Nottingham Queen's Medical Centre and up to the A&E department. I was then rushed to ICU and put into a medically induced coma for 3 days.

Prior to being put in the coma, I was resuscitated twice.

I will be unable to return to my current job role due to my injuries, which means I will be adjusting to life in a wheelchair.

I am determined to resume an independent life living in my own bungalow. The bungalow would need to be kitted out with furniture which would come at a cost.

-A suitable light weight wheel chair that I can transport around with me

Saturday 17th September 2016 The Moat Ground - Stamford AFC

Before the game there was an impeccably observed one minute's silence in memory of the young Shaw Lane player Dan Wilkinson who collapsed and died during their midweek game at Brighouse.

Gresley manager Damion Beckford-Quailey made changes to his back line for the visit of Stamford. Matt Roome and Ryan Walker replaced Jamie Barrett and Josh Egginton and Jordan Wakeling returned after serving his one match ban with Jake Carlisle taking a seat on the bench.

A late, late goal from Pearson Mwanyongo got Gresley out of gaol and his side's name in the hat on Monday for the next round of the FA Cup.

Almost from the off Stamford took control and were soon testing home keeper Rob Peet with a shot from distance by Jake Duffey. They went close again minutes but Jevani Brown's shot was tipped over the bar by Peet.

Gresley were struggling to get any sort of foothold in the game being pressed back into their own half but they did have one chance with a low shot from Walker straight at Stamford keeper Paul Bastock.

The Daniels took the lead on 17 minutes. Brown made a run down the left and managed to get to the bye line before sending a low cross across the box to the far post where Elliott Sandy was on hand to head the ball home from close in.

The home side were still finding it difficult against some resolute and at times physical defending with Reece Morris more than once the target.

Stamford's tactic of sending long high balls into Gresley's area was causing problems but when Gresley tried to reciprocate the danger was easily dealt with by the Stamford defence.

Duffy once more fired straight at Peet from a free kick, Brown blazed over when well placed just inside the area and the visitors finished the first half strongly with John King making a good run down the left moving the ball to Duffy who squandered a good chance firing wide.

Beckfod- Quailey said after the match that he'd 'had words' with his side at the interval and they came out looking like a different side for the second half. Making one change with Ben Harris replacing Eddy Samba Gresley looked far more positive and threatening going forward with Lucas Harrison's good run down the left ending with a well struck shot across the face of goal. Courtney Meade then hit a thunderous shot which keeper Bastock did well to tip over the bar.

Meade was looking more of a threat this half and broke forward towards the edge of the Stamford area only to be tripped by Delroy Gordon who received a yellow card from the referee.

Despite Gresley having the upper hand they were finding Stamford's defending solid and at times overly so with Morris still receiving more than his fair share of it.

Still, a mark of this season's Gresley side is that do not give up despite almost going further behind on 83 minutes but substitute Ryan Robbins could only scuff a shot wide of the far post which surely should have been put away.

Morris made a good run down the left before cutting in and racing across the 18-yard line but his final shot was a weak one straight at the keeper.

Meade was unlucky not to have leveled things on 90 minutes but the unfortunate forward could only watch as his shot from the right came back off the bar.

Gresley are making it a habit of scoring late goals and one duly arrived a minute into time added on, and what an important one it was.

Tendai Chitiza dribbled his way into the area but was felled by Jordan Smith giving referee Matthew Smith no option but to award the penalty.

With Gresley supporters' collective breath being held, Pearson Mwanyongo stepped up to take the kick and made certain sending Bastock the wrong way which means both sides have to do it all again on Tuesday night at the Zeeco Stadium, Stamford.

We lost the replay 1-0.



Was the remarkable comeback on. Well yes it was as two minutes later unbelievably Rovers were level. A superb run from Barker ended with him hitting an unstoppable shot past Smith.

Barker went an inch away from winning the game for his team when Sleigh fed the ball through to Barker who then hit another rocket of a shot which left Smith standing but the ball hit the bar flush on the front and the ball came back out. It would have been a fitting conclusion as the young man had had a great game and helped fully in the remarkable turn around full of determination character from his teammates claiming a fully deserved point at the very least.

GRESLEY ROVERS HISTORY

Gresley Rovers were formed in 1882 in the small mining village of Church Gresley, which is near to Swadlincote - the biggest town in South Derbyshire.

Their first ground was at Mushroom Lane in Albert Village a mile or so from Church Gresley and they played mainly friendlies and cup games for ten years before joining the Burton Junior League for the 1892/93 season. They won their first league title in the 1894/95 season eleven points clear of their nearest rivals in the Burton Junior League.

Rovers moved from the quaintly named Mushroom Lane ground (which they shared with the local cricket club Mushroom Lane CC) to the newly acquired Church Street Ground in time for the 1895/96 season. They stayed at Church Street till near the end of the 1907/08 season when they had to move as the land was required for building and moved across the road onto the newly acquired Moat Ground - the ground they still play on today.

Six seasons from 1985/6 Gresley finish 4th, 4th, 2nd, 3rd, Ist and 1st. During that period they also won the Derbyshire Senior Cup on four successive occasions. Season 1990/91 was a particularly good one for Gresley. In addition to the League Title and the Derbyshire Senior Cup win they also reached the final of the F.A. Vase and so had the honour of playing at Wembley. Their opponents were Guiseley and some National Newspapers reported it as 'the most exciting Wembley Cup Final ever'. Unfortunately, they only drew before losing the replay.

Paul Futcher was appointed manager with Garry Birtles, former England International, his assistant on 2nd November 1995. The season 1996/7 was the best in the Club's long history because in addition to retaining the Derbyshire Senior Cup they also won the Dr. Martens Premier Division championship, Rovers were unbeaten in their first seventeen league games (won 10 drawn 7) and were league leaders for 31 weeks. The title was finally won with a 3 - 1 home victory against Gloucester City at the Moat Ground on April 26th 1997. Gresley Rovers became the first Derbyshire side and first village side to win this prestigious trophy, but ground grading meant that they were unable to gain promotion to the Football Conference

After financial difficulties, Gresley Rovers liquidated at the end of the 2008–09 season, forming a new football club, Gresley F.C.

Gresley FC

Gresley FC was formed in 2009 and enjoyed a very successful first season in the East Midlands Counties League. The side. managed by Gary Norton, finished as runners up and therefore narrowly missed out on promotion. Gresley also enjoyed a long run in the FA Vase by beating Spennymoor, Dawlish and Long Buckby. The Dawlish tie in particular will live long in the memory as the original tie was abandoned in extra time and the Moatmen won the replay in South Derbyshire on penalties. The Vase run came to an end in front of the home fans in disappointing fashion at home to Whitehawk in the quarter-finals.

2010-2011 Gresley's second season as a club and also their second in the East Midlands Counties League saw another good FA Vase run getting to the last 32 and then going one step further from the previous season by winning the league after an exciting run-in. Being a few points behind the leading contenders Gresley could not afford to slip up again after an unexpected home defeat in early January if their dreams were to be realised. An amazing 20 game unbeaten run with the final 8 all victories saw Gresley crowned as champions and promoted into the Midland Football Alliance.

Season 2011-2012 saw another good run in the FA Vase reaching the last 16 and to top off a superb season Gresley achieved a remarkable back-to-back title success as they lifted the Midland Football Alliance title at their first attempt and promotion to the Evo-Stik NPL Division One South.

The first season back at level four was successful as Gresley settled into the Division One South.
Gresley finished just outside the top ten in the league and reached the 3rd Qualifying round of the FA Cup. At the end of the season joint manager Gary Norton stepped down with Martin Rowe named as manager.

GRESLEY ROVERS HISTORY CONTINUED

After losing their first two league fixtures of 2013-2014 and then an indifferent spell up to Christmas Gresley managed to stabilise their performances and ended the season in a creditable 9th place. However, in both the FA Cup and FA Trophy Gresley had good runs going out of the cup after forcing Conference South outfit Brackley Town to a replay after a good draw at St James Park in the 2nd Qualifying Round and in the Trophy they took Conference Premier side Wrexham almost all the way in the First Round Proper losing by the odd goal in three at the Racecourse Ground. In September 2014 Martin Rowe resigned and his assistant Wayne Thornhill was appointed as first team manager at the end of October.

Wayne, along with his assistants Jamie Barrett and Russell Peel. turned the season around and they finished in a creditable fifth place making the play-offs where they met Leek Town at Harrison Park who narrowly beat the Moatmen by a single goal. An appearance in the Derbyshire Senior Cup Final at the home of Chesterfield FC ended with Gresley as runners-up losing to Evo-Stik Premier side Matlock Town. At the beginning of September Wayne stepped down and Dave Langston appointed as caretaker manager. In October Scott Goodwin was appointed as manager with Jamie Barrett and Gary Rickets as his assistants. After a disappointing run of defeats Scott was released and Gary Ricketts appointed as player/manager assisted by Jamie Barrett and Dave Langston. The 2015-2016 ended with Gresley in a disappointing 16th position. Ricketts stood down as manager and former Leicester Nirvana

manager Damion Beckford-Quailey appointed in the close season. Damion's first season started well but the loss of three key players around Christmas time saw his side struggle for the rest of the campaign finishing in 18th position.

His second season 2017-2018 was not much better but it ended in a disappointing manner when the manager, management team and most of the players left the club with just four games remaining and the danger of being relegated. Former Moat boss Gary Norton stepped in to steer the club to the end of a trying season and using a mixture of reserve and youth team players managed to keep the club in step 4 finishing 17th. Norton agreed to take on the role of manager for season 2018-2019 and along with assistant Carl Slater and player/ coach Jamie Barrett have started to rebuild a side that hopefully be more competitive than the last two seasons

Early in January 2019 Norton stood down and Gavin Hurren was appointed as manager. Unfortunately, at the end of the season, Gresley were relegated from the Evo-Stik East to the Midland League. Hurren left early in the new season to be replaced by David McDermott. Gresley's results failed to improve and in February McDermott was relieved of his position. Former manager Gary Norton again stepped in to steer the ship until the end of the season.

Gresley Rovers Return

During the summer of 2020, the Gresley FC board met to discuss the possibility of re-naming the club and a unanimous decision

saw the Gresley Rovers name return to non-league football. Joint managers of Carl Abbott, Gary Norton and assistant manager Paul Thomlinson had the job of recruiting their players after the previous season was curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic and non-league football allowed to start again.

After a stop/start end of season the FA completed their reorganisation of non-league football and Rovers were placed in the new United Counties North Division under the leadership of Carl Abbott

2021-2022 proved to be a successful season finishing runners-up in the United Counties league but gained promotion due to points-per-game and are now members of the Northern Premier League Midland Division for 2022-2023

A difficult first season back at step 4 ended with Rovers gaining the points to enable them to keep our place in the Northern Premier League Midland Division for another season.

2023-2024 was a deeply disappointing season for Rovers. A poor start saw manager Carl Abbott relieved of his duties in October and Marc Strzyzewski appointed but things did not improve and after a relegation position for most of the remaining season and relegation to Step 5 saw Strzyzewski also let go during the close season.

Carl Abbott returned as manager for the new season


